Welcome to apartment number 87F in 'Pizzo Beach Club' and we hope you and your guests will enjoy your holiday at the resort complex.

To ensure you enjoy your visit, we have listed below a few points of information which you should be aware.

- When entering the resort, you will require a swipe card to open the gate. Once the front gate opens, you enter and wait for the gate to close behind you, once this happens, the barrier will then open automatically.
- When leaving the resort, both the gate and barrier open automatically.
- Any household rubbish, bottles or plastic must be discarded on a daily basis. The recycling rubbish bins can be found at the front of the resort by the front office to the left hand side when exiting. Please ensure you separate all recyclable goods.
- The electricity supply provided at the apartment is 4.5kw supply. To avoid any interference in supply, please try and limit the amount of electrical goods in use at the onetime i.e. avoid having a shower the same time the cooker, washing machine and air con is on.
- If your power trips, please check the fuse box inside the apartment, if a switch is down, please flick it back up. If whatever reason the inside switches are all ok, please locate your external fuse box and check to see if the switch is down. If the problem still exists please notify your agent and they will rectify the problem asap.
- As electricity charges are very high, we ask all our guests to be conscious of running the air conditioning when doors are open and please do not leave the air con units on when there is no one in the apartment.
- Checkout time is 10am on the day of departure, unless prior arranged. We ask that all guests dispose of any rubbish, leave any towels on the floor in a separate pile to the bed linen. We also would appreciate that the apartment is left in a satisfactory level of cleanliness on departure.

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Activities:

- If you wish to reserve a tennis court for 1 hour, please do so at the front reception area, between the hours of 9am and 1pm. The same applies for the use of the football grounds.
- The use of the gym is only allowed to persons over the age of 15 years. The opening times are from 9:30am until 8pm daily.
- Children under the age of 5 years must be accompanied by an adult while using either of the swimming pools.
- Sun loungers by the pool or beach cannot be reserved by placing a towel on the lounger.
- Inflatable sun loungers, plastic rings etc; are not allowed in the pool.
- The restaurant in Pizzo Beach Club is now operating and also the bar. Reservations for evening dining must be reserved through the front desk between the daily hours of 9am and 1pm. The restaurant is open from 7:30pm until 11pm. The menu consists of fish, meat, pasta, starters, desserts and many more choices to choose from.

Bus Service:

We are delighted to announce the new introduction of a daily bus service from the resort to the historic centre of Pizzo town.

Daily bus route consists of:

- Pick up at the resorts administration office
- Drop off at the main car park in the centre of Pizzo

Times:

- Pickup at 9am and return at 12pm
- Pickup at 3pm and return at 6pm
- Pickup at 7pm and return at 9:30pm

The price for the return trip is €8 per person; please book in advance at the reception in Pizzo Beach Club between the hours of 9am and 1pm, Monday to Saturday.

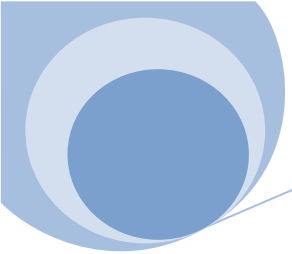
Reduced entry passes for Club Med can be purchased at the reception at Pizzo Beach Club.

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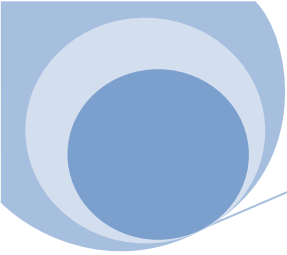
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Important information to know about Calabria

- Mobile phone reception can sometimes be very poor. To avail of the best network coverage available in your area, change the settings of your phone under 'operator selection' and set it to automatic.
- In most tobacconists and local stores you can purchase international phone cards from as little as €5 and avail of cheaper call rates to landline and mobile phone numbers in many European countries.
- Toilets – Most restaurants in Calabria unfortunately do not have toilet seats, so if you are planning on going out for a nice meal you may want to consider bringing some extra toilet paper with you in your bag.
- Eating times – A number of shops, restaurants and cafes close for siesta time, 1pm until 4pm. It's worth noting that many restaurants do not start up their pizza ovens until 8pm at night, so please consider this when preparing to go out for a nice meal. The Italians prefer to eat late from 8pm until midnight.
- Shopping – Many larger retail outlets and shopping centres do not open until 2pm on Monday and stay open until 9pm. Every other day they remain open from 9am until 9pm Tuesday to Sunday. The most popular shopping centres are the 'Vibo Center' in Vibo Valentia and also the 'Due Mare'. Situated in the heart of Vibo Valentia, this commercial centre is easy to find, with signposts directing you from all towns, bringing you right to the front door of the centre. It has over 60 stores and parking for over 300 cars. Some major brands like Zara, Benetton, Gamestop, Euronics and Spar are just a few examples of the top brands taking up residence in the huge commercial centre. It's a great day out for all the family, especially if the weather takes a turn for the worse.
- Italian Driving – The Italians are known for their love of speed on the roads. We advise all our clients to be that extra bit more cautious when driving in Calabria, never use mobile phones. The Italians love to drive the white line especially when turning a corner, please be aware of this fact and try and drive closer to the inside verge.
- When ordering food, the Italians normally have their main course dish completely on its own, whereas many other nationalities are used to an accompanying dish like salad, fries or potatoes. If you would like both dishes to arrive together, please use the word 'con' which means 'with' or 'insieme' which means 'together'

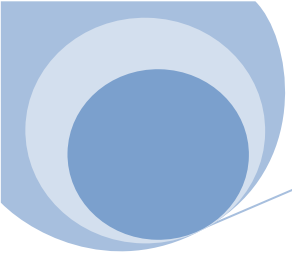

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Lamezia Terme

Lamezia Terme is closely associated with the sea. The town is surrounded by white and unpolluted beaches and beautiful bays both of the Tyrrhenian (to the west) and the Jonio side (to the east). Moreover, the upper plain of the Sila to the north with its stunning mountains and alpine landscape is rich in forests and lakes. In the area around Lamezia Terme there are also important artistic sites and Greek, Norman and Roman temples as well as palaces from the Bourbon times, can be found across the region.

The coastal road from Lamezia to Pizzo Calabro - Tropea - Capo Vaticano (direction south) – called Costa degli Dei, Gods' Coast - through Tropea is one of the most beautiful in Italy and the latter town is famous for its characteristic town centre which looks out spectacularly onto the sea.

On the other direction following the coastal road direction north, you'll find nice touristic villages on the other side of the grey beaches like Gizzeria, Falerna, Campora, Amantea. All of them are part of the Lamezia Gulf.

From Lamezia, you can also decide to literally "cut" the region, going on the other side. From the Tyrrhenian Sea to the Ionian. From the Airport or from the Due Mari shopping Centre, follow the Catanzaro direction, and then go right following Soverato.

Soverato is another fantastic touristic place. Is called the Rimini of Southern Italy with lot of Disco, restaurant and places where you can dance all the night on the beach. Before Soverato, don't miss Staletti, Copanello and their incredible beaches! Famous discos in the area are the Scogliera di Pietragrande, the Rebus, la Marinella (on the beach).

The local cuisine is interesting and rich and largely undiscovered. Try the Novecento Restaurant in the old town of Nicastro, the Marechiaro in Gizzeria, ot the very expensive but fantastic Ashley a 5 star hotel and restaurant in La Marinella Village always in Lamezia Terme just 3 kms far from the Airport and Central Station. Another very chick, modern and london style (chelsea) place to spend a day out (with swimming pool, hotel rooms and restaurant is in Falerna Marina. The Taga'. When you go there, ask of Marcello, the owner.

If what you are searching for is the mood of an Irish Pub, don't miss the biggest Pub in Calabria, the Cavallino Bianco just in the back of the Corso Numistrano Nicastro's Mainstreet

Lamezia Terme is a combination of three separate villages. The most important is Nicastro with its cathedral, the main street called Corso Numistrano, the Archaeological Museum and the splendid remains of the Federico Barbarossa Castle where during the summer is not difficult to find music and theatre. Nearby there is Caronte Terme where you can indulge in a bubbly natural Jacuzzi or in the swimming pool or having any SPA treatment you'd like.

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Lamezia Terme is the best shopping Centre in Calabria together with Cosenza.

The biggest Shopping Centre called "I Due Mari", is just 5Km far from the Airport. You can find more than 50 different shops.

In the City Centre (Nicastro), you can find the best shops with all the Italian best "firme" like Prada, Armani, Benetton, Sisley etc. but also a very nice market where you can buy fresh fruits, vegetables, meat and lot of typical regional food.

Golfing

Feudo Montalto Golf Club is situated in Limbadi, a small town near Capo Vaticano and Tropea. The 9 hole course, designed by Baldovino Dassu, has been built in on an old farm and lays among orange and olive trees. For a small fee of up to €30 per person, you can spend the day golfing here on this amazing course, once your game is completed; your fee allows you to play as many rounds as you wish.

The Sila's

The Sila is the name of the mountainous plateau located in Calabria, it occupies part of the provinces of Cosenza, Crotona and Catanzaro, and is divided into the Sila Greca, Sila Grande and Sila Piccola ranges. The Sila houses the eponymous National Park. Camigliatello is a classical alpine village, a great spot for exploring amazing densely wooded areas during the summer, if you enjoy hiking then you will love the 3 mile climb up to Monte Botte Donato and take in the breath taking views of the Ionian and Tyrrhenian seas. In winter, the Sila's becomes one of Italy's best cross-country skiing areas. The season can start from November right through to the end of February and with slopes as long as 7km in length, it is a great experience for both advanced and intermediate skiers alike.

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Pizzo

Pizzo is another beautiful town just a few minutes' drive from the apartment, famous for its Chiesa di Piedigrotta, a church completely carved out of the tufo rock near the beach. This Calabrian town is also famous for its tartufo, a special delicious kind of ice cream celebrated with a festival in Pizzo every August. A visit to a renowned ice cream parlour, Enrico's, situated in Marinella, is a must for all ice cream lovers.

Zambrone

Zambrone town offers every amenity and has a traditional piazza, bars, pizzeria, fresh meat from the local butcher, fresh fish delivered every day. Zambrone Marina has many seasonal bars and restaurants, with excellent food and a large selection of locally made wines available. Priscopio has 2 restaurants, at La Collinetta and Pirapora in season.

Gerace

Gerace is inland from the coastal town of Locri, but its elevation allows views of the sea. Gerace is sometimes called "the Florence of the south" for its art and architecture or the "city of saints" for its religious buildings. If you wish to see one of the largest religious buildings in Calabria then you must pay a visit to Gerace's Norman Cathedral.

Crusies

Mini cruises to the Aeolian Isles depart from the port of Tropea/Capo Vaticano around 7:00am on a 350 seater air conditioned motorship. On this daily trip you get to visit Stromboli, the famous active volcano plus Lipar. Arrive back at Tropea around 19:15pm, a day well spent, don't forget to bring your camera and savour those magic moments. 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Tropea

Tropea is a town in the Vibo Valentia province of Calabria. Tropea is well known for its miles of white sandy beaches and turquoise coloured water and of course it is nicknamed the home of the 'Red Onion'. There is also an annual Blues festival in the centre of Tropea during September, live bands playing in an open air atmosphere most nights during the festival. Tropea dates back to the 17th century with cobbled narrow streets, charming cafes and a vast amount of souvenirs and fashion shops speckled along the winding and meandering laneways. It's great to just sit outside one of the cafes of an evening, have a frothy cappuccino and watch all of the Italians enjoying their evening stroll through the streets of Tropea.

Like a fractured metatarsal on the foot of Italy, the Tropea promontory juts out into the turquoise Tyrrhenian Sea, its superb white-sand beaches shielded by high cliffs. The town of Tropea pulls off a rare trick by managing to be both fashionable and unspoilt, a maze of steep narrow streets, Renaissance churches and yellow-stone palazzo.

Sunday Times put Tropea at number one spot in its 'Top 20 Beaches' report in January 2007.
